When I first learned of The Discovery Program, I must admit, I was a bit confused. I could not understand how the brain could be "exercised" by doing seemingly simple, repetitive tasks. As I learned more, researched more and talked to more people in the education field, I was absolutely, thoroughly impressed. Obviously, I learned that the exercises were not simple and repetitive. They were each very deliberate tasks. Each task is designed to work with the individual student to maximize the brain's potential. The process is scientific and proven.

Since the program is so individualized, we had to change "therapists" at one point to find a better fit for my son. Not that there was a problem, it was just deemed that another therapist would be a more suitable fit. I guess you could say they were "tweaking" or fine tuning the fit. (The word "therapist" sometimes has negative connotations-in this case, the term is used because the therapist is a highly trained specialist who actually works with the brain to maximize it's potential.)

My son has recently completed the program. The results are remarkable. He was able to work his way through 7th and 8th grade in one school year. (He was retained in 2nd grade due to undetected learning disabilities.) The program is designed to work with each individual's learning style, pace, personality and learning disabilities, if any.
